All mileage is reimbursed at the State of Florida approved rate of \$0.445 per mile based on city-to-city map mileage found on the Florida DOT website.

Did you know?

Starting July 1, 2018, volunteers who travel out of county more than 50 miles (round trip) can request reimbursement for their mileage simply by completing a short form that verifies their mileage and the reason for the trip. We want to make it easier for volunteers to “Go the Extra Mile” for our kids!

The same goes for transporting relative placement children and children in foster or group care, long distances for important events such as family visits, college interviews, sibling visits, etc.

Going the Extra Mile?



Many Guardian ad Litem volunteers travel long distances to represent the abused and neglected children they represent. This can involve children placed out of circuit, and sometimes out of state; arranging and observing family visits; or driving for holiday visits or family funerals.

The 2018 Florida Legislature appropriated funds to reimburse extraordinary travel costs, and Governor Rick Scott approved this funding in the General Appropriations Act.

Reimbursement for extraordinary travel may affect your income tax claim for federal tax deductions. Please consult a tax professional if you have questions.

What Travel Qualifies for Mileage Reimbursement?

You can request reimbursement for mileage if:

- you travel out of county more than 50 miles round trip to visit a child you are appointed to represent, or
- you travel more than 50 miles round trip to transport a child age 5 or older to a sibling or family visit, or an important event in the child's life such as a college visit, a family event, a job interview, or a relative's funeral, or
- you travel *any* distance to transport a courthouse dog to a GAL-related event where they will comfort kids, or
- you travel out of state or need to fly out of state (with advance approval from your Circuit Director).

The child must be in foster, group or relative care to qualify.

Exceptions must be approved in advance by the Circuit Director. If you have any questions, ask your Child Advocate Manager or Circuit Director, or call the GAL Finance Office at 850-922-7213.

Please be sure to provide the justification or results of your trip on the reimbursement request form. This is very important.
