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Anna Valencia:

It's almost like being a counselor and being able to connect the two to see why did they get here in the first place? What do they have to do to fix the situation?

Anna Valencia:

They're the individuals that need the most help. A simple thing, like a coloring book make them excited. We're able to speak to the children, see what they want, what their wishes are. We're able to speak to the parent and see what it is that they feel frustrated about. It's all worth the frustration. It's worth seeing the children. It's worth being part of their lives. The most rewarding part is being able to interact between the mother, the grandmother, the child, and knowing that we're doing something about trying to get them connected. I suggest that they definitely come in, go through the training, take the time to really be part of what's going on because this is so dynamic. The more volunteers we have, the more that will be done to fix the problem. I highly recommend becoming volunteers.
